- 2) The following proxies have been submitted for the purpose of voting:

- 3) Vice President Redman led the organization in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 4) Vice President Redman introduced the guest speakers for the meeting.
 - a. Barbara Moore, Executive Director of the Democratic Municipal Officials (DMO) Association.
 - Executive Director Moore introduced herself and DMO. DMO is a sister organization of the Democratic Governor's Association, the Democratic Attorney's General Association, and others under the Democratic National Committee. DMO represents all the Democratic municipal officials like mayors, city council, village trustees, etc.
 - Spoke about establishing a strong chapter in Illinois. Highlighted Leadership Circle Member & DMO National Board Member Gilbert Villegas.
 - iii. Spoke about ways that IDCCA and DMO can work together. Asked Chairs to tap 1-2 municipal officials within every county to join DMO.
 - iv. Asked Chairs to flag candidates who are running that could use DMO support.
 - v. Took questions from the membership.



- vi. Introduced Alderman Villegas to speak more about DMO.
- b. Chicago Alderman Gilbert Villegas (36th Ward), IDCCA Leadership Circle Member, National Board Member – Democratic Municipal Officials Association
 - i. Spoke about building a partnership with the IDCCA, the Democratic Party of Illinois, and DMO with the goal of electing Democrats throughout the state.
 - ii. Spoke about DMO being the "bench" for the Democratic Party. Looking to identify 1-2 municipal officials in every county.
 - iii. Announced a DMO Reception on Tuesday September 28th as part of the Illinois Municipal League conference. Invited all County Chairs to attend.

5) President's Report

a. Vice President Redman announced that President Zahorik will deliver her report at the next meeting.

6) Secretary's Report

- a. Secretary Pam Monetti presented the minutes from the May 15, 2021, General Membership Meeting.
- b. Katherine Daniels (Adams) made a motion to accept the minutes as submitted. Christine Ballard (Ogle) seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

7) Treasurer's Report

- a. Treasurer Miller was not able to participate in the meeting but submitted the Treasurer's Report.
- b. Patrick Cortesi (McLean) made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as submitted. Brian Short (Menard) seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

8) Executive Director's Report

- a. Executive Director Dan Kovats thanked the Summer Interns including Franklin Borre, Juliana Fray, Zach Lee, and Emily Wollet.
- b. Announced two Virtual Training Series sessions including Ballot Access (8/23) and the Elections Legislation Briefing will be rescheduled for September.
- c. Thanked the Executive Board Members who reviewed and approved the IDCCA Sexual Harassment Prevention Policy. Spoke about the organization push to have all County Chairs sign this policy. To date, 64 County Chairs have signed and returned their Prevention Policy.
- d. Spoke about the updated Political Director information that was included in the County Chairs Packet. Spoke about the contact information for all four of the Secretary of State candidates. Any Chair that is interested in having any of our elected officials or candidates attend their events should contact the Political Directors directly.



- 9) Summer Brews Young Professionals Reception
 - a. Thanked our co-hosts Greg Bales and Zach Koutsky for their efforts to make the event successful.
 - b. Reported that this event was our largest "non-Brunch" event in our history with over 350 people in attendance.
 - c. Reported that the organization raised \$21,687.60 for the event.
 - d. Announced that this event will continue next year, and the organization will host a fall Young Professionals event.

10) County Chairs' Brunch

- a. Announced several mitigation measures to make the event safe to attend. These measures include:
 - i. All attendees will be required to wear a mask indoors.
 - ii. Seating will theater style with at least 2-3 feet separation to allow for social distancing.
 - iii. Food will individually be wrapped and prepackaged. Food will be placed on every seats. Hot breakfast sandwiches will be available at stations throughout the venue. Bottles of juice and water will be available.
 - iv. There will be hand sanitizer stations at every entrance to the venue.
 - v. Crowne Plaza staff will be wearing masks and gloves throughout the
 - vi. Asked everyone to plan on picking up their tickets from the IDCCA office the night before the event. Asked all Chairs to submit the names of all their attendees in advance so they can pick up their own tickets.
 - vii. Asked all County Chairs to be flexible if there are any changes to the mitigation measures.
- b. Spoke about the addition of the IDCCA buttons that identify County Chair, Leadership Circle, Boot Camp Alumni, Labor Leader, Precinct Committeeperson, or Elected Official. This mirrors what takes place at the National Convention.
- c. Spoke about the VIP Reception and invited all County Chairs to participate. This will allow for a sit-down breakfast for all VIPs and Chairs.
- d. Announced that former Randolph County Chair Barb Brown and former McLean County Chair John Penn will be honored with the Party Builder Awards.
- e. Announced that the Ad Book has set a record for size (64 pages) and amount raised.
- f. Announced that the 50 / 50 Raffle continues to bring in donations. To date, we have sold 111 tickets. Announced that this fundraiser is behind what it has raised in previous years.



- g. Announced that we have expanded merchandise options for the Brunch including "Elect Illinois Dems" t-shirts, our annual "Brunch" shirt, and a donkey kicking COVID buttons.
- h. Announced that Boone's Saloon has been placed on the "Do Not Patronize List" by the Springfield & Central Illinois Trades & Labor Council.
- i. Announced the financial totals for the event to date:

ICYMI: Illinois Congressional Republicans Vote Against Women's Right to Choose

Springfield, IL - Last Friday, <u>every Illinois Congressional Republican voted against</u> protecting women's reproductive rights when they opposed the <u>Women's Health Protection Act</u>. Illinois Democratic County Chairs Association (IDCCA) President Kristina Zahorik issued the following statement:

"Republicans across the country are attacking women and their reproductive rights. Last week, Kinzinger, Miller, Bost, Lahood, and Davis all failed Illinois women with their opposition to legislation that would protect women's constitutional right to determine their health care choices."

"Americans watched Texas Republicans pass an extreme anti-choice law which essentially bans abortion even in cases of rape or incest. This vigilante-esque law hurts women and allows strangers to sue those helping women get the health care they need. When Illinois Congressional Republicans were given an opportunity to protect women from extreme state legislation like that in Texas, they said no. Illinois voters should not forget."

The <u>federal legislation that passed on Friday</u> provides a statutory right for health care providers to provide abortion services without limitations such as those passed in Texas, and essentially codifies *Roe v. Wade*.

Congressional Republicans Skip Out On Their Tab

Illinois Congressional Republicans Won't Raise Debt Ceiling to Pay Trump Debts

Springfield, IL - Today, Illinois Congressional Republicans -- Representatives Rodney Davis, Mike Bost, Mary Miller, Darin LaHood, and Adam Kinzinger -- all voted no to pay our nation's bills.
